II. Activities

The Consulate General of India in Sydney and the Swami Vivekananda Cultural Centre hosted the Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR) empanelled troupe, the Punjab Cultural Society led by Shri Ravinder Singh Ranguwal. Numerous workshops for students and performances for the community were organised in New South Wales and South Australia. The troupe also performed for Independence Day at the Centre in the morning and grand evening reception held by the Consulate General of India, Sydney and the Swami Vivekananda Cultural Centre at the prestigious Sydney Cricket Ground.



The Punjab Cultural Society had a folk-dance workshop for the children and teachers at the Sydney Sanskrit School at Wentworthville Public School. Over 100 students, teachers and parents had a fun time participating. The troupe also performed and introduced various traditional musical instruments to the students.
